- 11th Annual Ontario Bike Summit was attended by 275 delegates
- Over 60 speakers sharing their work and experiences on Vision Zero, shared mobility, transportation equity, policy advocacy and network planning
- Opening remarks delivered by The Honourable Jeff Yurek, Minister of Transportation
- Keynote address on "Expanding Bike Lane Conversations: Exploring the Infrastructure and Social Dimensions of Safe Streets" by Placemaker & Author Jay Pitter

Share the Road Announces 3 New Bicycle Friendly Communities

The Bicycle Friendly Communities Program has now recognized 44 communities for their work to build safe and connected communities. Seventy-percent (70%) of Ontarians now live in a Bicycle Friendly Community.






Who Was There

Professional Breakdown of Delegates (%)




What They Thought
